

Do you need help paying for health care?

A Summary of Range's Financial Assistance Policy

We treat all our patients with respect, whether or not you can pay for your care. And we will treat any patient in an emergency. But what happens if you get a medical bill, and you **can't** pay it?

You can apply for help through one of our programs: Charity Care and Senior Partners.

How do I apply for Charity Care?

Anyone can apply for Charity Care. Get the Application form on our website at <http://www.range.fairview.org/fap.aspx> You can also get one by calling or visiting our office.

How do I apply for Senior Partners?

Senior Partners is for Minnesota residents with Medicare Part A and Part B. The program helps with charges that Medicare does **not** cover, like deductibles. Here's where to apply:

Who can get help through Charity Care?

Find the number of people who live with you. Then follow across to find where your family's yearly income fits.

Income Limits by Family Size

Family Size	Annual Gross Income (200% FPL) up to 100% benefit	Annual Gross Income (300% FPL) up to 50% benefit
1	\$24,120	\$36,180
2	\$32,480	\$48,720
3	\$40,840	\$61,260
4	\$49,200	\$73,800
5	\$57,560	\$86,340

Notes: 1. Patients who qualify for financial help will **not** be charged more for emergency or other medically needed care than amounts generally billed to people who have insurance that covers the care.

2. Fairview will **not** sue you or garnish your wages until we have made reasonable efforts to find out if you qualify for aid. (Lawsuits and garnishments are called Extraordinary Collection Actions, or ECA.)
